> Washington, D.C. HACU's Annual National Capitol Forum on Hispanic Higher Education brings together members of the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities with elected officials and government leaders to advocate for the legislative priorities of Hispanic-Serving Institutions. Your voice as presidents/CEOs, faculty, administrators and students is crucial. Our leaders need to hear directly from you.

> The two-day Forum commences with pre-conference events including a Fireside Chat with the U.S. Department of Education and free workshops on Federal Funding Opportunities and grant procurement resources available to HSIs. The Opening Plenary luncheon will be followed by a Federal Partnerships Plenary and sessions with distinguished speakers and presenters on the pressing issues affecting HSIs.

> On your Capitol Hill visits, we ask that you advocate for greater federal investments in HSIs and request congressional support in six priority areas: equitable funding for HSIs; the passage of the HERE Act; increasing authorization levels for Title V-Part A and Title V-Part B; immigration reform; increasing the Pell Grant; and establishing a Capital Financing Program for HSI infrastructure upgrades. We hope your conversations equip our congressional leaders with the information they need to better understand the request for greater federal investment in Hispanic education, HSIs and for programs that contribute to student success.

> Together, we can elevate our voices and urge legislators to increase federal funding for HSIs and the over 5 million students they educate and serve. We encourage you to share HACU's Legislative Agenda, higher education priorities and information and resources from this Forum with your campus communities and encourage your campus leaders to engage members of Congress and enlist others in continued advocacy in support of our HSIs.

> We are grateful for the support of HACU's Governing Board for their exemplary leadership and guidance to advance our mission and to our Corporate and Philanthropic Council for their unwavering support. We also thank all our sponsors and partners for their contributions towards making this event possible. 



The key to the *All of Us* Research Program is diversity. Diversity of people, data types, and ways of life. The more we know about what makes people unique, the more customized health care can become. That's why we're asking one million or more people to join us. Did you know that Hispanics/ Latinos make up 18% of the population? Yet only 5% are involved in medical research.


