



The Elements of Successful International Programs

- 1. Effective Collaborations Among Institutions
- 2. Agreed-upon Goals and Measures of Success
- 3. Learning Experiences Must Build the Capacity of Students and Faculty to Collaborate Across Cultures
- 4. Project-based Experiences for Students, with Clear Objectives and Time Lines for Completion

UNM's IPEX Program

- Stands for "Indigenous Planning Student Exchange and Curriculum Program."
- Designed to provide students in planning and closely related fields with an international exchange experience in the emerging field of indigenous planning.
- Involves exchange partnerships with the Universities of Manitoba and Saskatchewan in Canada, UNM and Arizona State University in the U.S., and in Mexico the Universidad Autónoma de Chiapas and Benemérita Universidad Autónoma.
- Semester long exchanges include language and cultural instruction, as well as classroom and project work in indigenous planning.
- Workshop and Conference on "Models of Indigenous Development" held in Chiapas in February 2011.
