









The framework: 4 PILLARS – 3 VECTORS

Four Key Demographic Facts

- By 2020 racial and ethnic minorities will outnumber
 Whites among those 18 years of age and younger.
- By 2030 all baby boomers will be older than 65 years of age.



Four Key Demographic Facts

- 3. By **2045**, Whites cease being the majority.
- 4. Between 2050-2060, 30% of the population will be Latino, and 32% of those under 18 will be Latino.




EDUCATION PILLAR

- **College Enrollment 2010 to 2017**
 - Latinos 22% to 36%
 - Whites 39% to 41%
 - Asians 56% to 65%



EDUCATION PILLAR

- **College Degrees in 2017** (ages 25 and older)
 - Latinos 22%
 - Whites 45%
 - Asians 52%
 - Blacks 30%
 - All 39%



EDUCATION PILLAR

- College and Income
 - A college degree
 generates at least
 \$1M more in a lifetime
 of earnings over a High
 School Diploma.



ENTREPRENEURSHIP PILLAR

- Latinos start businesses
 3X faster than other racial and ethnic groups, including Whites.
- Latino businesses = 42% of all minority firms, & 12% of all U.S. businesses.



WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PILLAR

- In 2017 there were 6.2M job openings employers could not find hires.
- CNN Money: "Job seekers tend to lack the skills in demand"
- * "Workforce development coordinates public and privatesector policies and programs that provide individuals with opportunities for a sustainable livelihood, and helps organizations achieve exemplary goals." Emergence of Workforce Development. Jacobs and Hawley



LATINO PHILANTHROPY PILLAR

Growing numbers of Latinos participating in Latino Giving Circles, and other related activities of the Latino Community Foundation, signaling growth in formal Latino philanthropy.





Latino Prosperityshould be a NationalEconomic Priority.


