OVERVIEW OF HISPANIC-SERVING SCHOOL DISTRICTS

In 2005, the term Hispanic-Serving School Districts (HSSDs) was introduced by HACU as a metric to capture the growing number of Hispanic students in the K-12 educational system. HSSDs are defined as school districts with 25% or more Hispanic student enrollment. In the 2015-16 school year, there were 3,343 HSSDs enrolling 78 percent of all kindergarten through grade 12 Hispanic students in the United States or 10.4 million individuals. 
Percent of students attending HSSDs who are Hispanic

US born account for 81% of Hispanics ages 35 or younger in 2016




Hispanics under 18 years old, grew by 22% from 2006 to 2016
