



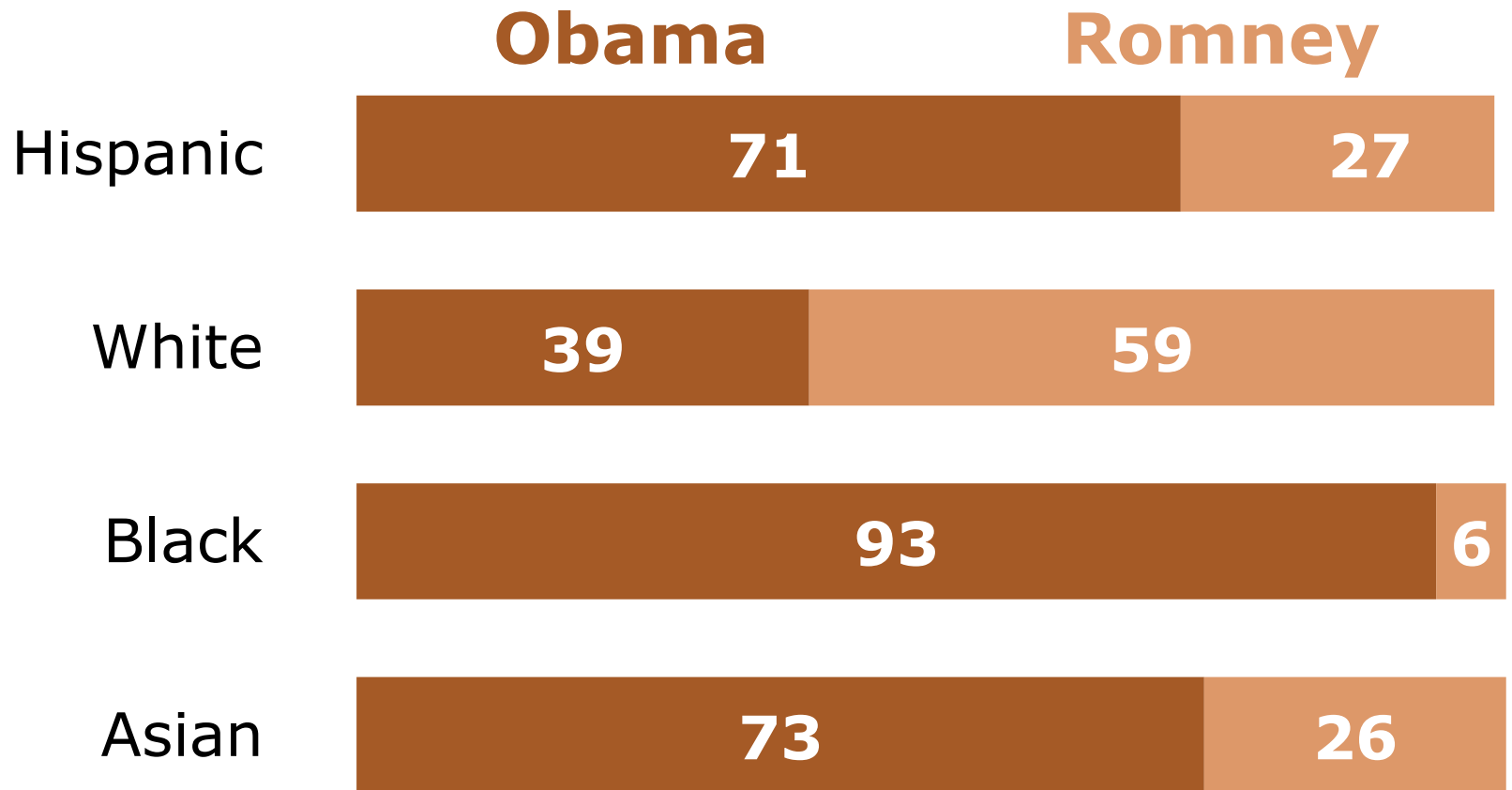

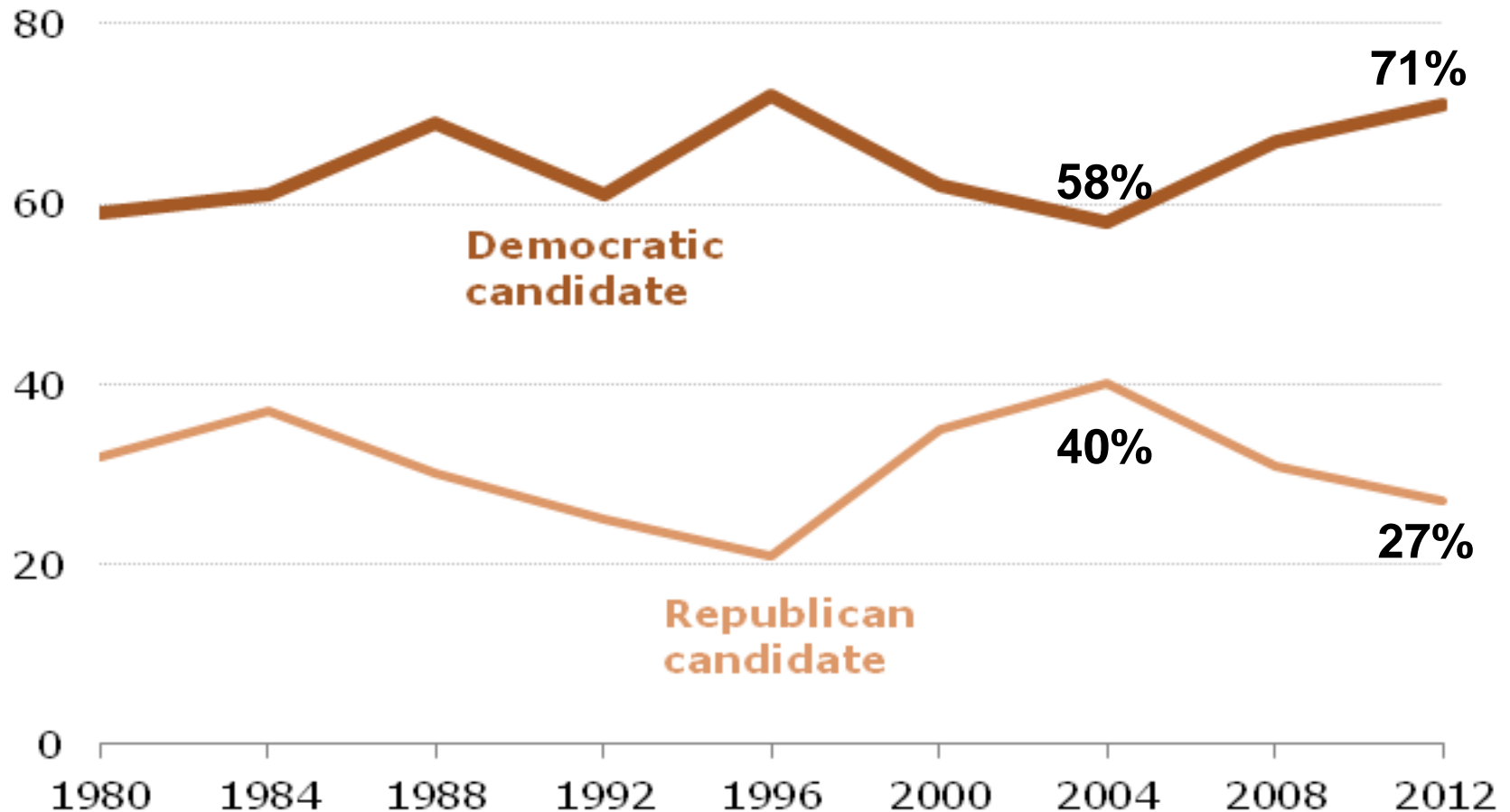

# 2012 Presidential Vote, by Race/Ethnicity

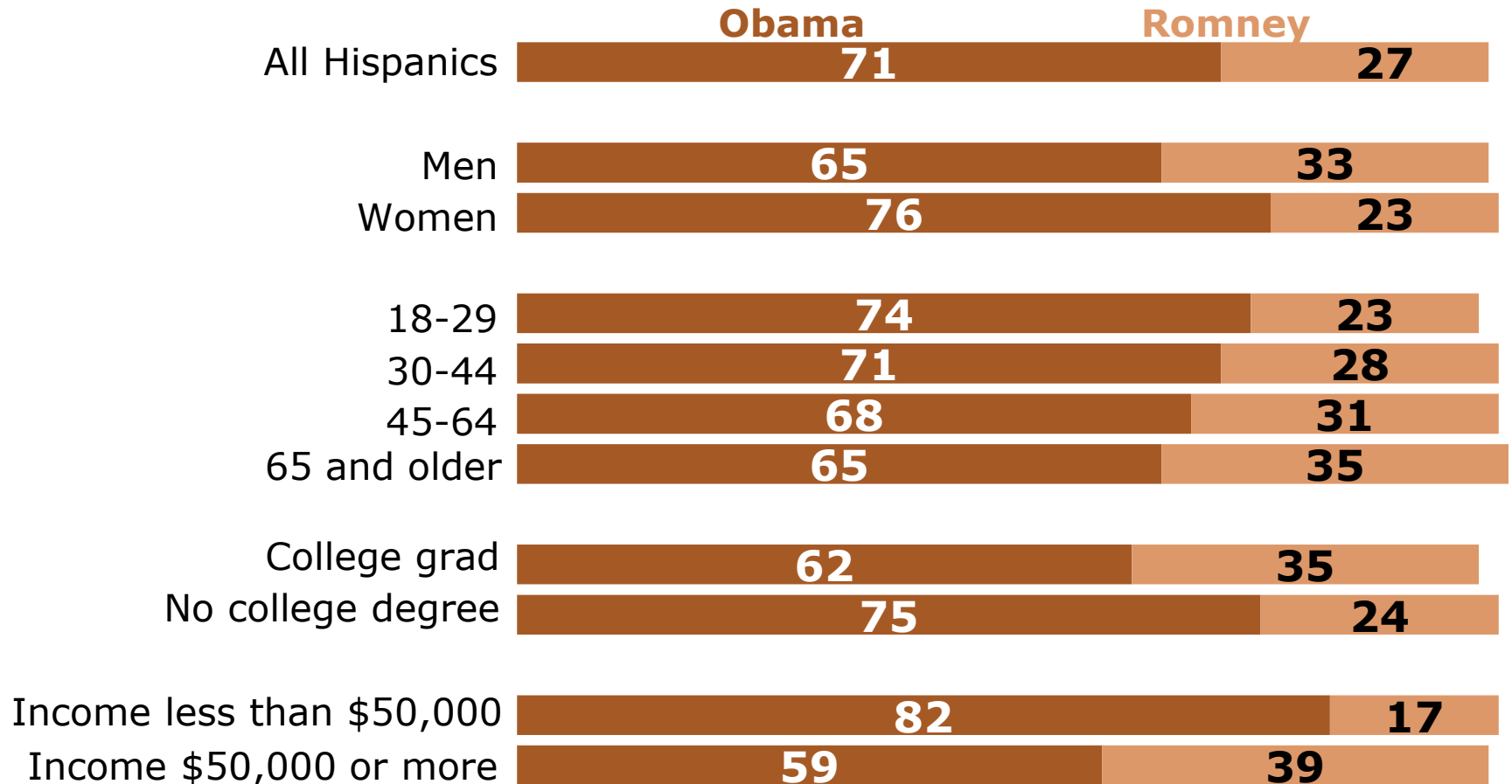

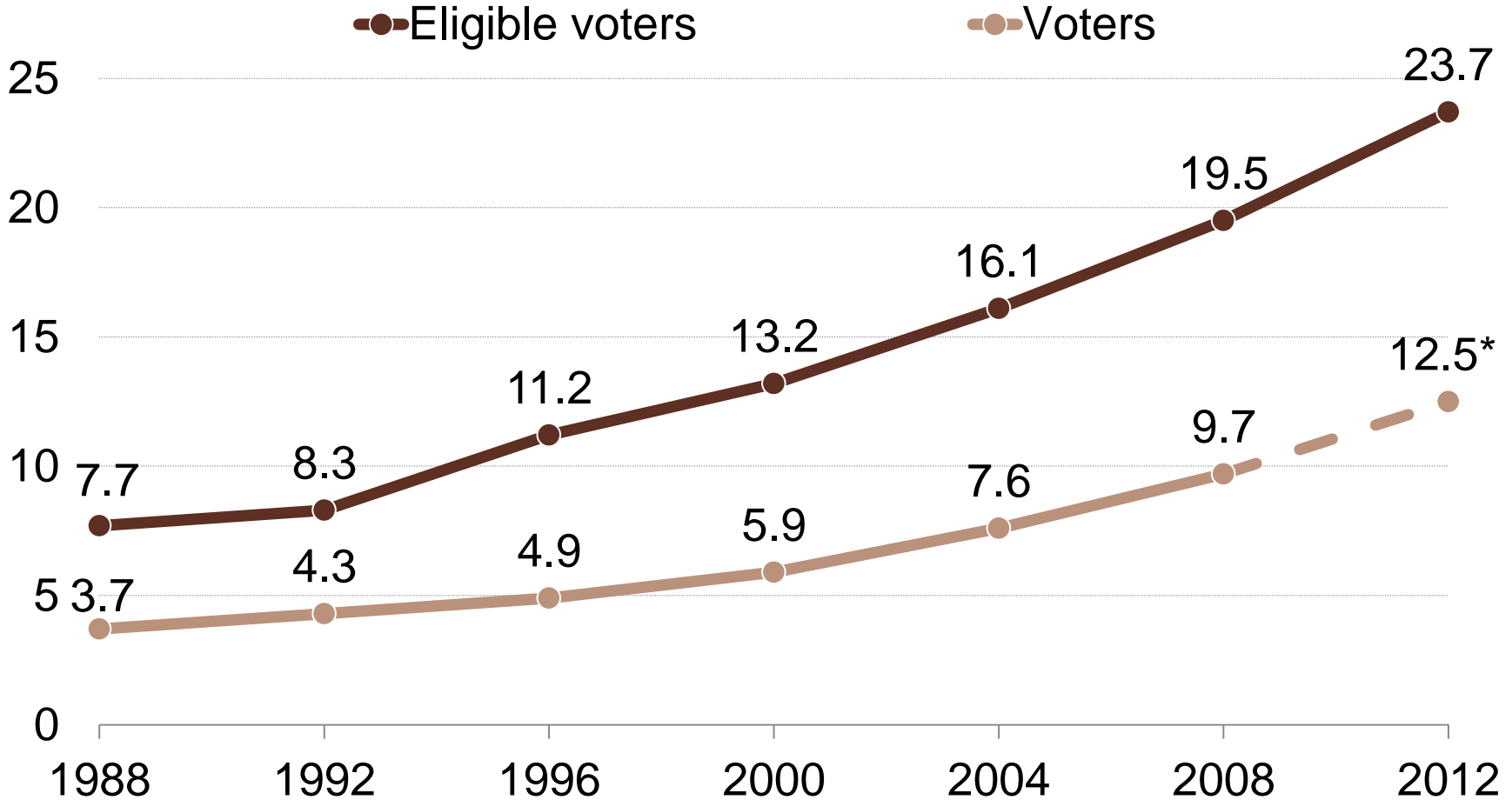
# Hispanic Popular Vote in 2012 Presidential Election

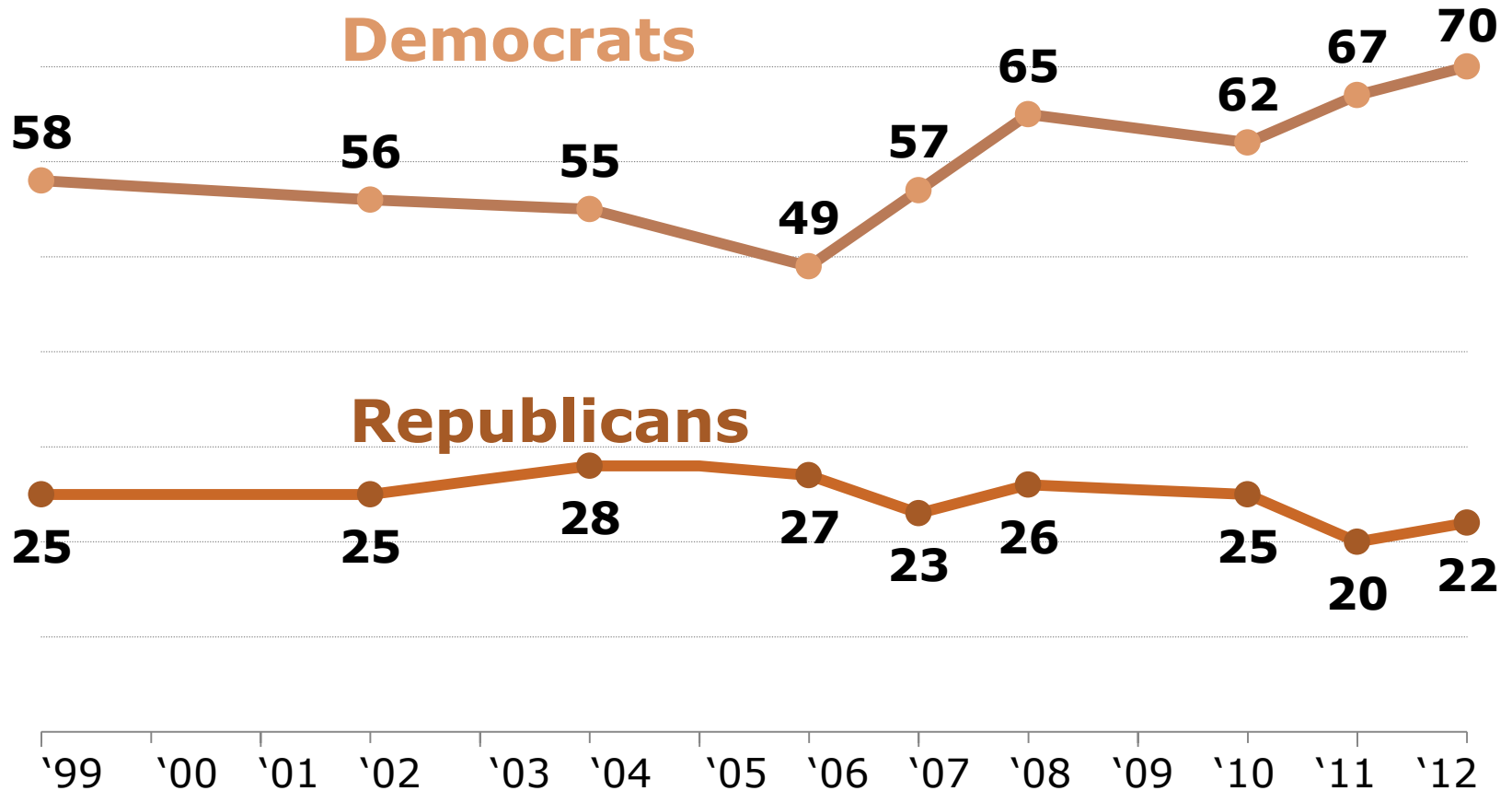
# Latino Participation in Presidential Elections, 1988 - 2012

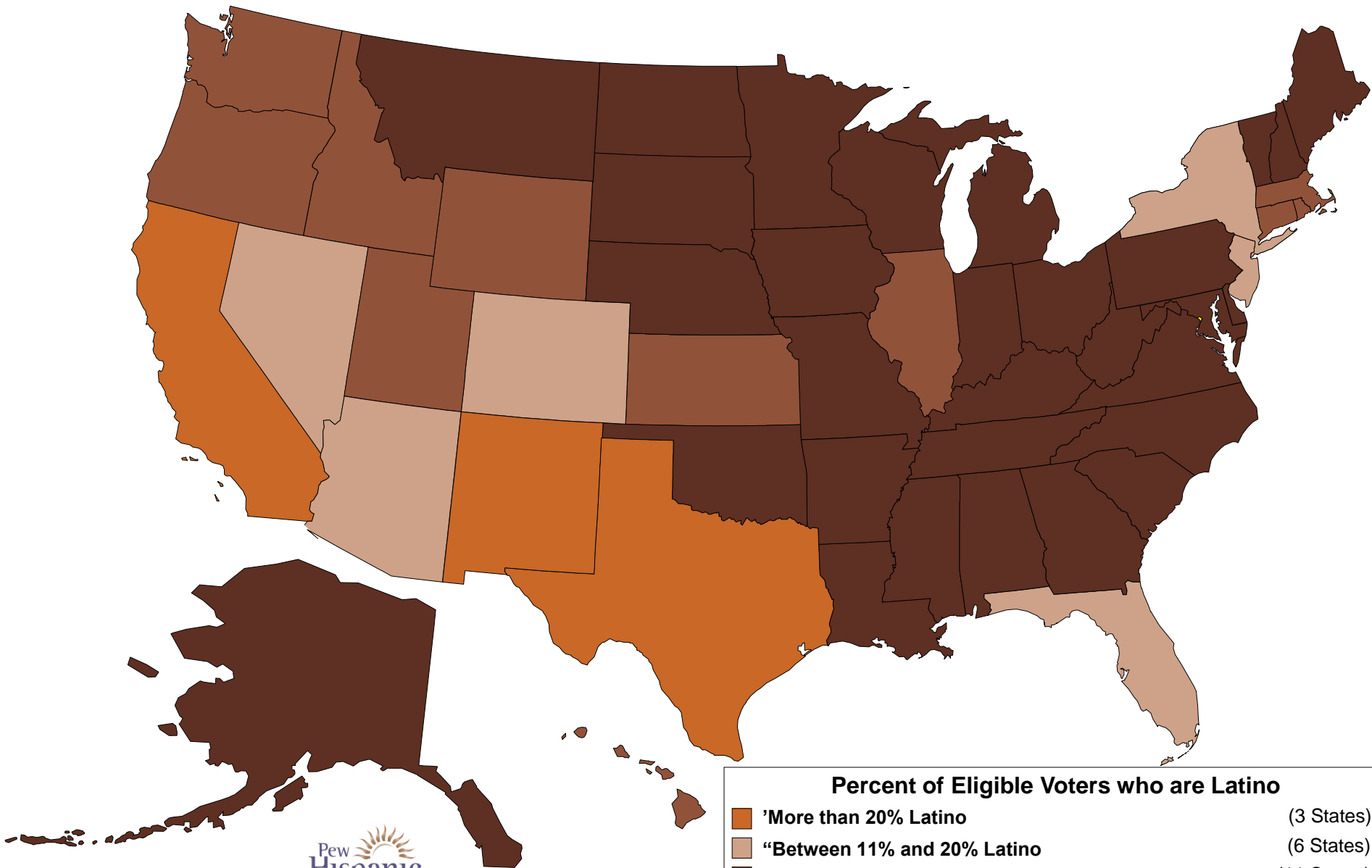


# Party Affiliation among Latino Registered Voters

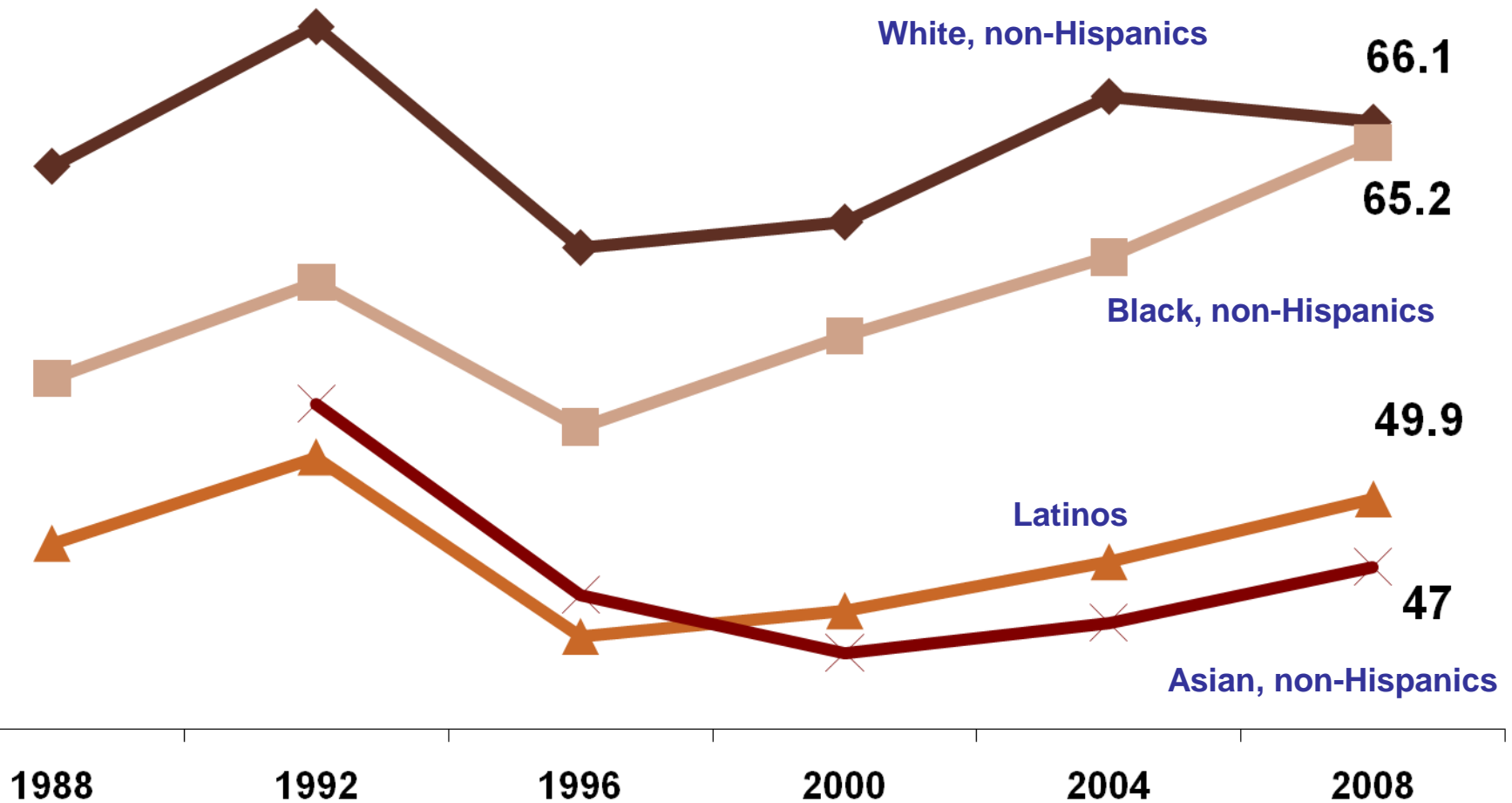

# Voter Turnout Rates in Presidential Elections

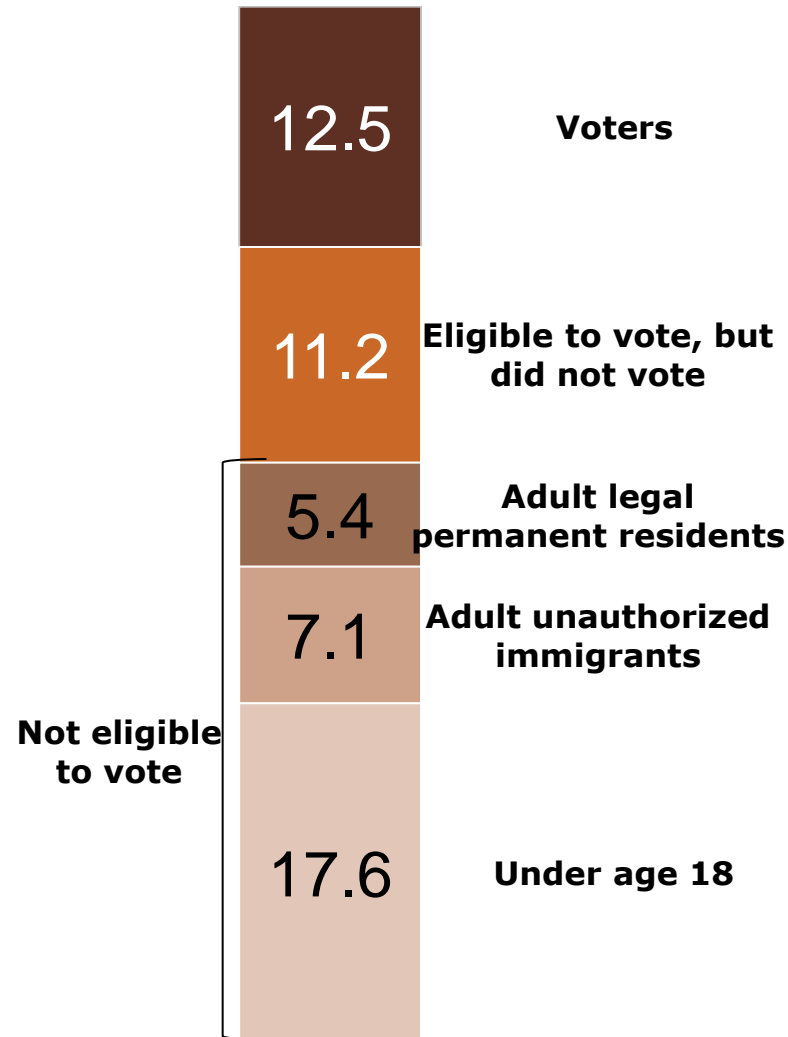
Percent of U.S. citizens ages 18 and older who voted

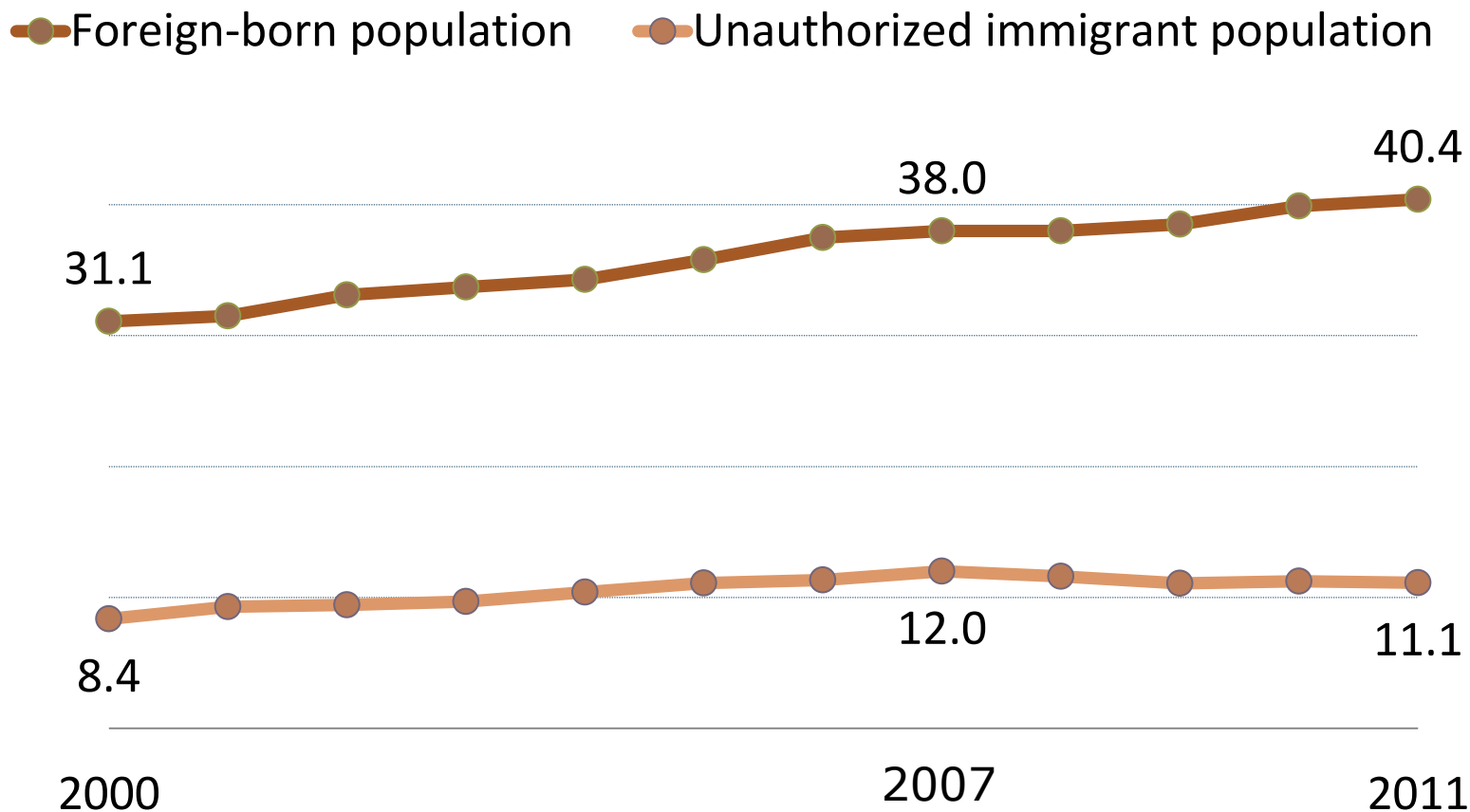

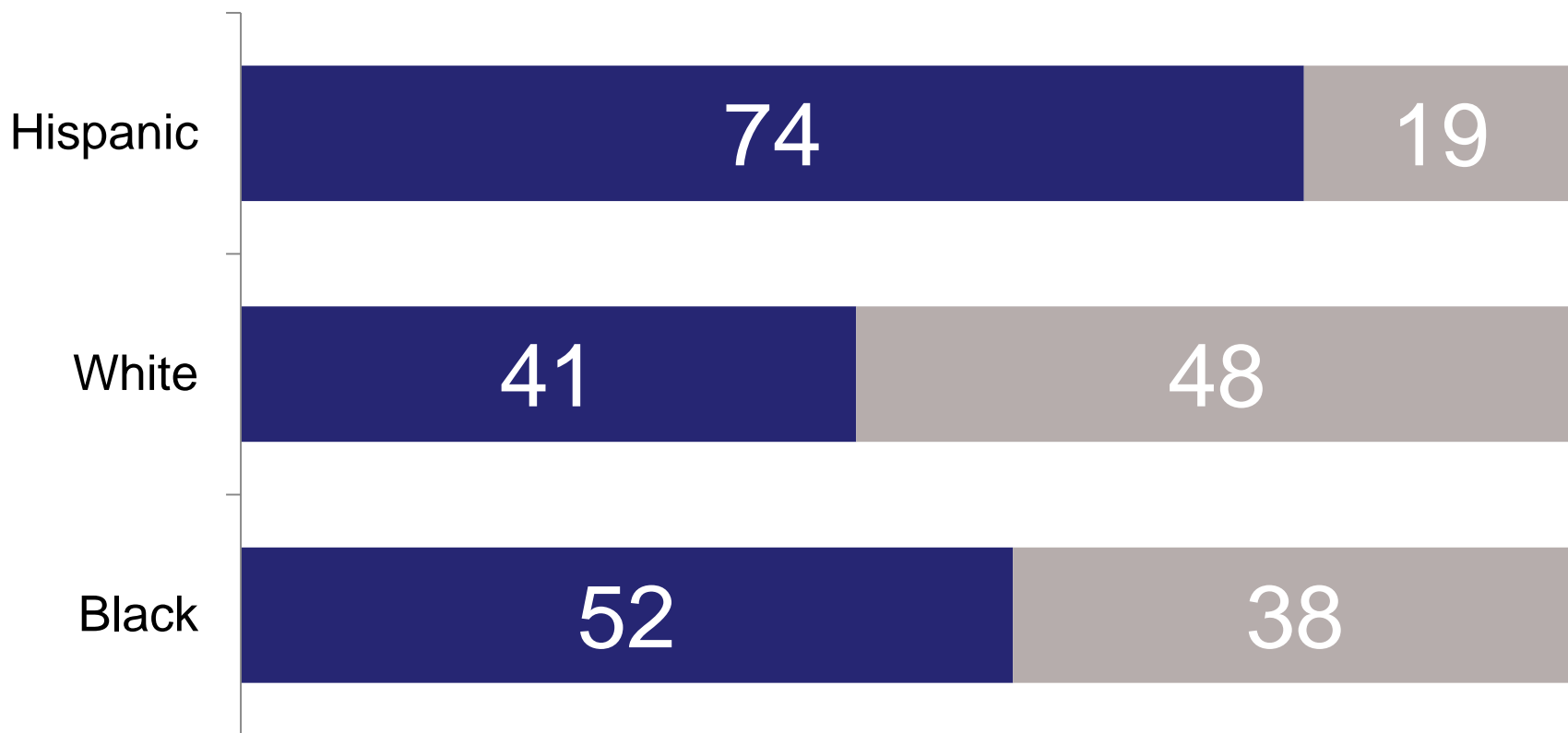

% among adults

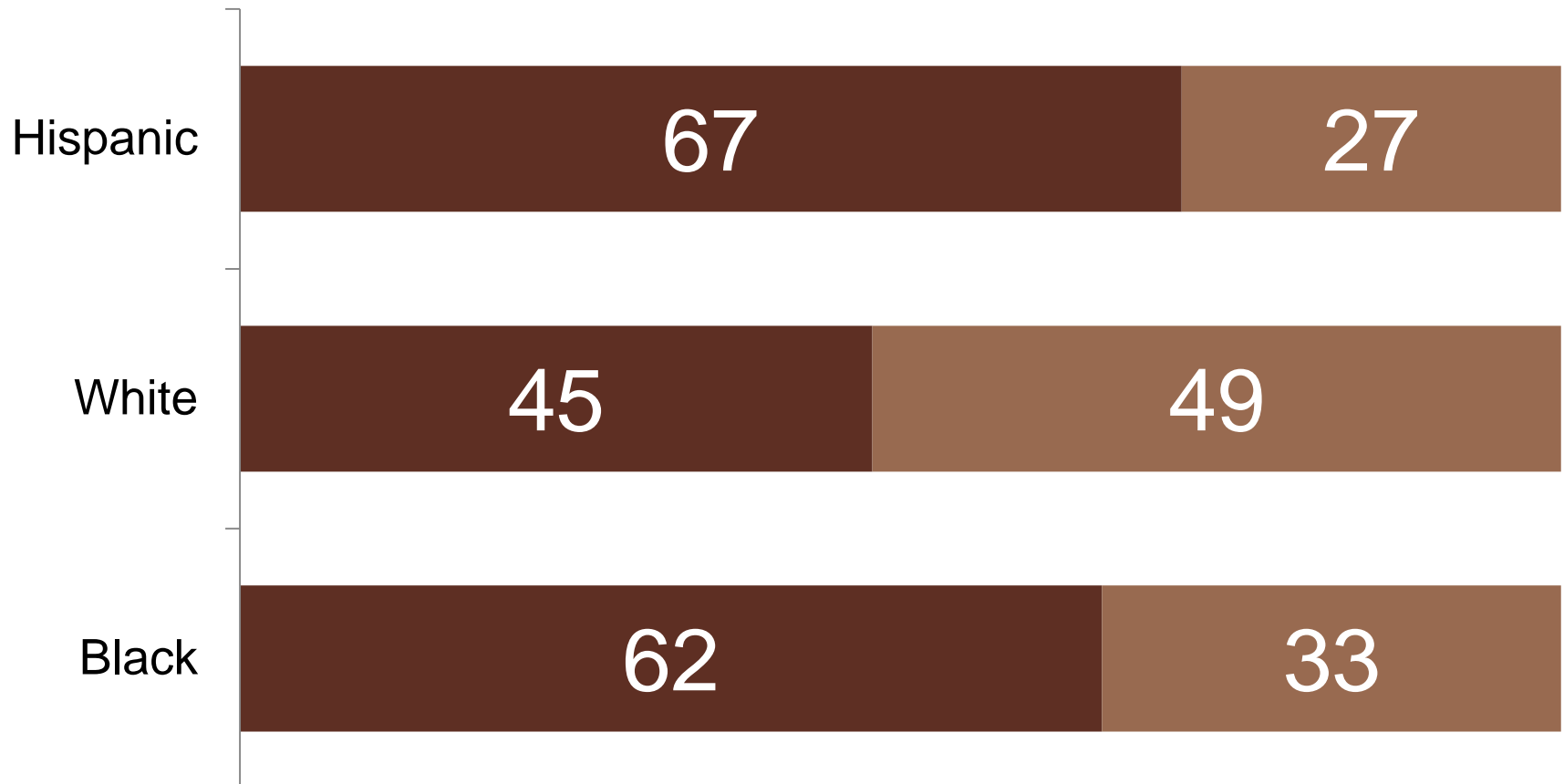
- Strengthen country w/ hard work and talents

■ Strengthens American society ■ Threatens American values



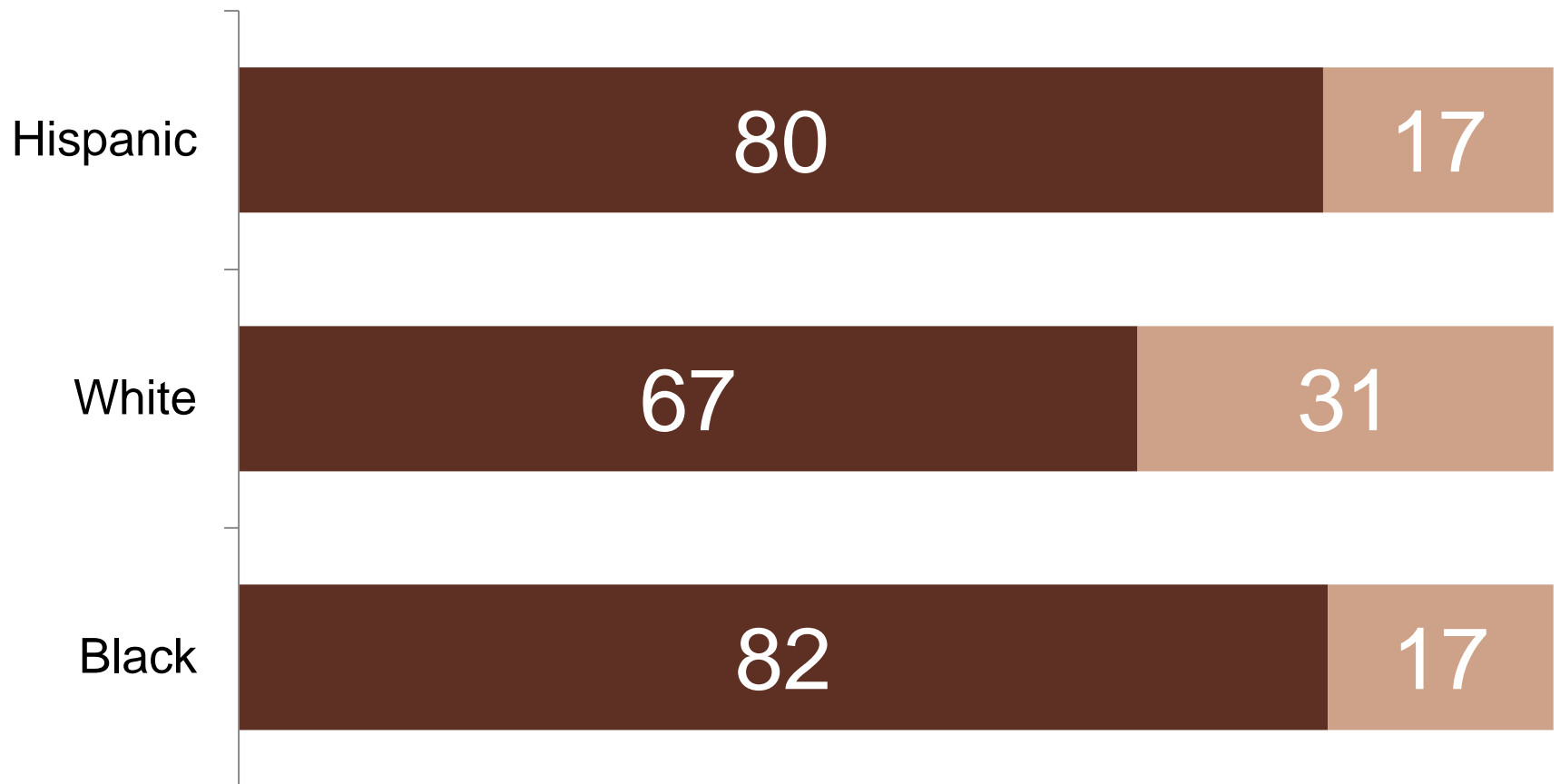


# Broad Support for Legal Status for Unauthorized Immigrants

■ Allowed to stay legally

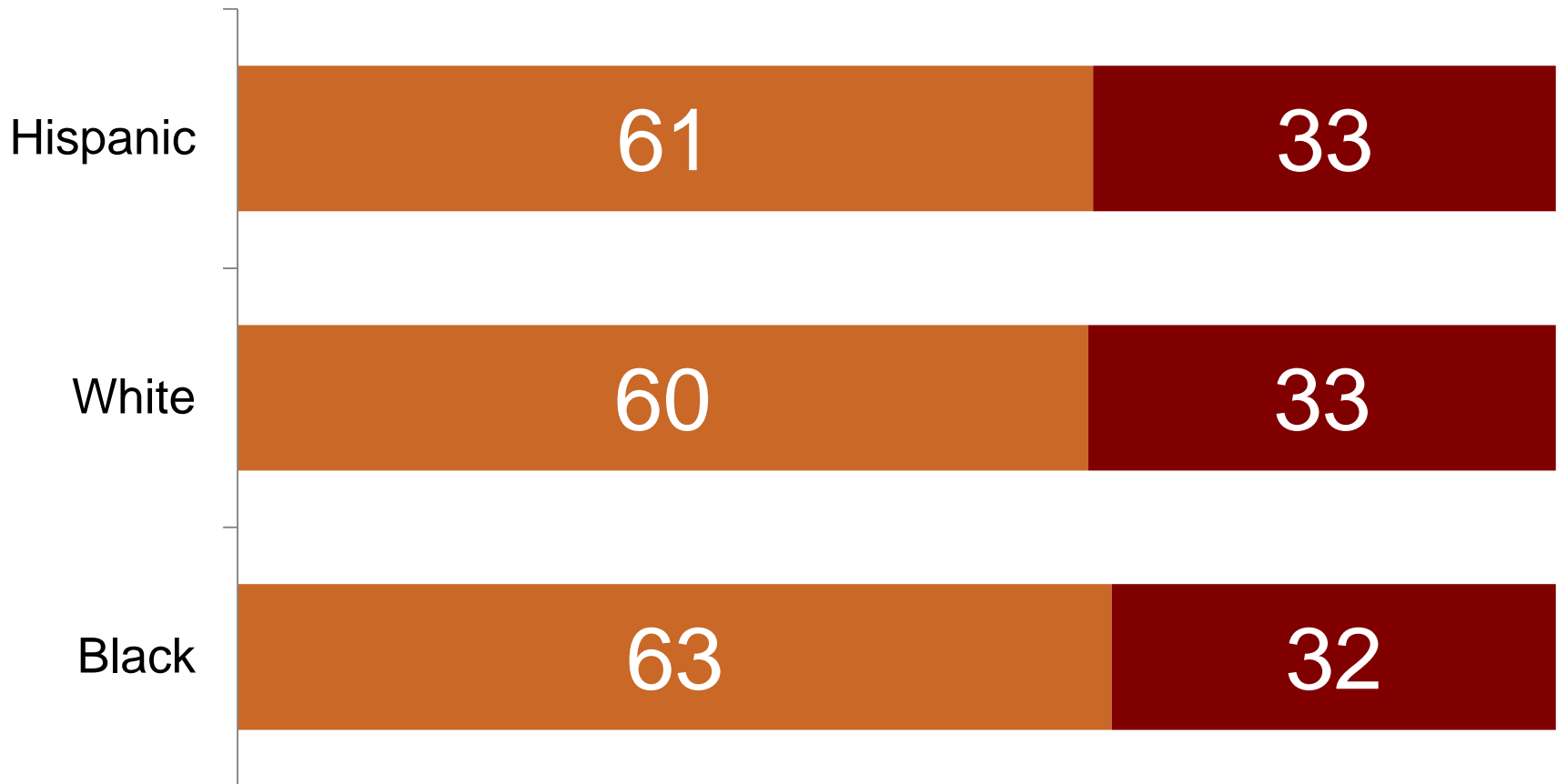
■ Not be allowed to stay legally

■ Citizenship ■ Permanent residency



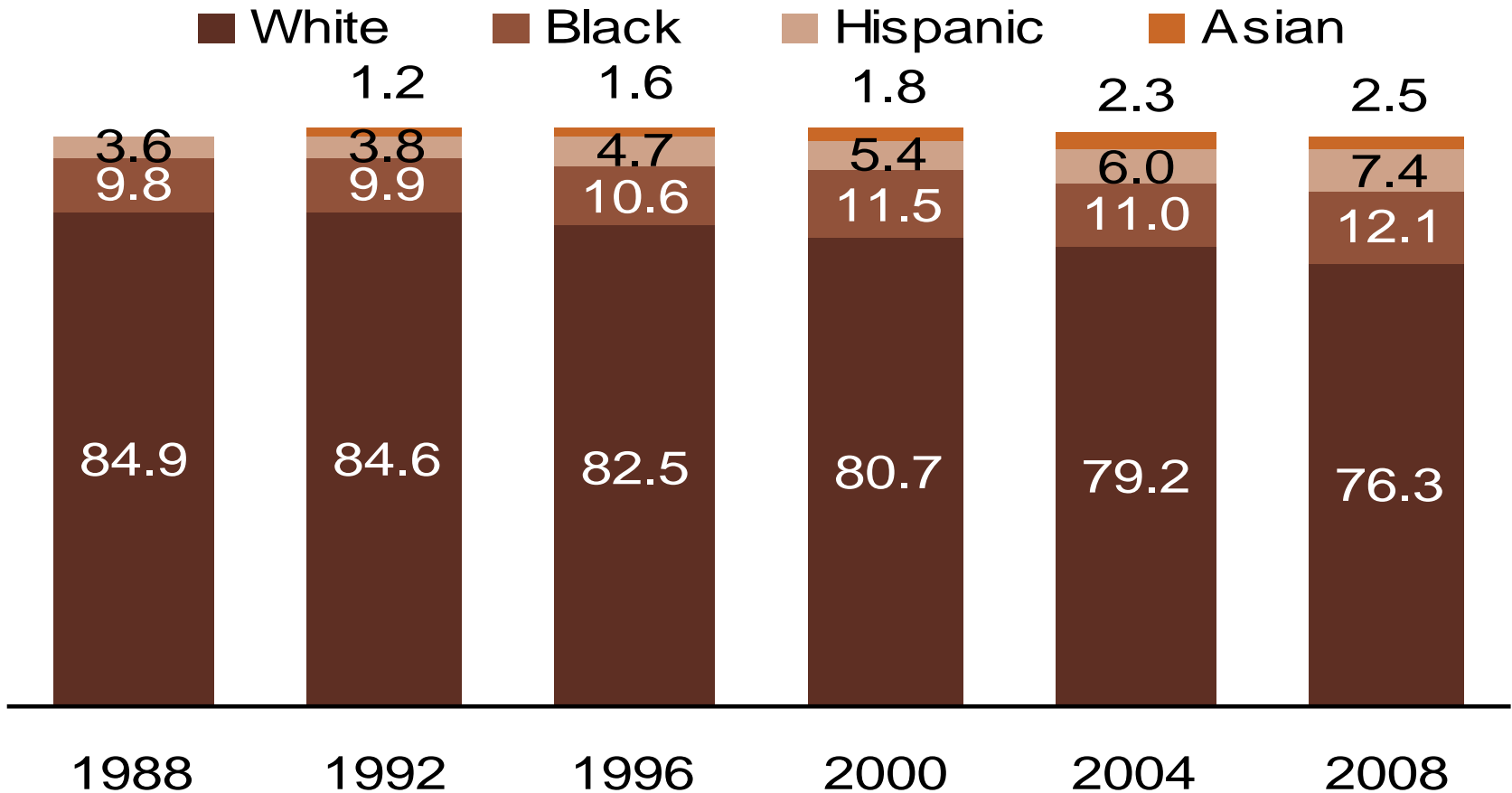
